Bahrain








Get your adrenaline pumping on this actionpacked off-road driving experience at Bahrain's International Circuit - the ultra modern motorsport facility located in the heart of the Sakhir Desert.

Sit back and enjoy the sights as you travel by coach from the port, through Bahrain's capital, Manama. Catch the distinctive dome of the Al Fateh Grand Mosque, the stunning architecture of the Bahrain National Museum and the impressive twin towers of both the Bahrain World Trade Centre and the Financial Harbour, before joining the Sheikh Salman Highway to the Bahrain International Circuit.

This \$150 million facility offers some unbeatable features. As well as its famous Formula One race track, it boasts a dramatic off-road course built into the desert landscape. Designed to put the world's leading 4x4s through their paces, the course includes 32 natural and man made obstacles, including the aptly named



Rocky Road, Camel Humps and Boomerang Climb. Buckle up as you, and up to three other passengers, navigate different terrains with a qualified rally driver behind the wheel of a Nissan Patrol. Then it's back to the port after what promises to be an adventure to remember







Enjoy a whirlwind tour of Arabian culture and cuisine in this fun-packed day that takes in some of Bahrain's most enchanting sights.

Your tour begins with a visit to the majestic Al Fateh Grand Mosque, one of the largest in the world. Named after Bahrain's 18th century founder, the mosque can accommodate up to 7,000 worshippers at a time. Its architecture reflects a combination of Middle Eastern styles, but its crowning glory is a giant fibreglass dome, weighing more than 60 tonnes.

Next, it's on to the Bahrain National Museum, the country's most popular tourist destination. With exhibits depicting life in Bahrain through the ages – including a reassembled ancient burial ground dating back to 2,800 BC – the museum's nine halls are a treasure trove of information and insight into the region.


Our next stop will be Manama's bazaar, located in the heart of Bahrain's capital. Split into new and old sections, you'll find everything from clothes and antiques to spices and traditional medicines in stalls spread across the souq's labyrinthine lanes and alleyways. Just make sure you've left space in your luggage!



From bazaar to Bahrain Fort, one of the country's most important historical sites. The fort itself was built by the Portuguese in the 16th century, but excavations of the site have revealed evidence of six other eras, including that of the Dilmun civilization in around 3,000 BC

You'll conclude your Bahrain adventure at the 4-star Novotel Al Dana boutique hotel and resort for some well-deserved relaxation and a bite to eat. Enjoy a non-alcoholic welcome drink on arrival, followed by a delicious array of traditional Arabic mezze, kebabs and dishes from the grill. All washed down with a glass of wine. Then it's back to the port to reboard the ship.







Join us on this tour round Bahrain's most famous sights and landmarks in just one day.

Our first call will be the AI Fateh Grand Mosque with its iconic fibreglass dome – one of the largest in the world. As well as its importance as a place of worship, it is also home to the Islamic Center library with a collection of more than 7,000 religious texts, reference books and periodicals

Then it's on to the country's most popular tourist destination: the Bahrain National Museum. This beautiful postmodern building overlooking the waterfront houses artefacts and exhibits spanning 5,000 years of Bahrain's history, from the ancient Dilmun civilisation onwards. A truly immersive introduction to the region and its people.

On the way to our next destination, we'll make a photo stop at Athar, a beautiful structure in the heart of Manama, which celebrates the contribution of Bahraini women to their country and its culture.

Next is the historic Bahrain Fort, a site steeped in ancient history. Although the fort itself dates back to the 16th century, when it was built by



the Portuguese, excavations of the site have shown that the area has been populated since 2,300 BC and it may well have been the capital of the ancient Dimun empire.

The Al Jasra Handicraft Centre is our penultimate stop, located in the village of the same name. As you move through the Centre's rooms, you'll see examples of some of the country's traditional crafts, including palm weaving, pottery and woodwork.

Before we head back to the ship we'll make a final stop at the impressive King Fahd causeway - 25 kilometres of bridges and causeways completed in 1986 and connecting Bahrain and Saudi Arabia for the first time in 25,000 years.









Strap yourself in for an exhilarating karting experience at the world-class karting facility at Bahrain International Circuit.

The excitement begins on your coach trip from the port through Manama, Bahrain's capital city. Soak up the sights as you pass the famous landmarks of the AI Fateh Grand Mosque, the Bahrain National Museum, the Bahrain World Trade Centre and the Financial Harbour. Then it's on to the Sheikh Salman Highway and straight to the Bahrain International Circuit.

The Karting Circuit is part of the larger International Circuit, which is home to one of the world's best Formula One race tracks. The karting track was the first in the world to host a championship-level race at night but its state-of-the-art facilities are open to enthusiasts as well as die-hard racers. You'll get to put one of their agile karts through its paces as you navigate the 1.4 km track, designed to the highest international standards and catering to different experience and confidence levels. Enjoy a true taste of the fast-paced life of motorsport before heading back to the port and rejoining the ship.







Join us as we take a whistlestop tour round Bahrain's most famous and photo-worthy sights and landmarks.

First one for the photo album will be the Al Fateh Grand Mosque. With its combination of architectural styles and huge fibreglass dome, its scale is something to behold.


Next stop, the Bahrain National Museum. Built in 1988, this \$34 million postmodern complex overlooking the waterfront offers visitors a fascinating view of Bahrain through the ages, thanks to artefacts dating back to the ancient Dilmun civilisation.

The Bahrain Fort will be our next photo opportunity. Site of an ancient tell (a mound created by centuries of rebuilding) and a former Portuguese military fortification, this is one of Bahrain's most important historical locations and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



Moving on from the ancient to the very modern, we'll make our way to the 25-kilometre-long King Fahd causeway - an impressive series of bridges and causeways connecting Bahrain and Saudi Arabia. Capture its grandeur as it stretches into the distance across the Gulf of Bahrain

Our tour concludes at Bahrain's World Trade Centre - the second tallest building in Bahrain. 240 metres high, the World Trade Centre's twin sail-shaped, 50-storey towers are connected by wind turbines. As it's the first building in the world to include these in its design, it's well worth a snap.







Pearling was central to trade in Bahrain for thousands of years and in this half-day tour you'll discover the rich history of what's known as the pearling pathway – 3.5km of walkway connecting three oyster beds, the Bu Mahir Fort and 17 buildings in the historical section of Muharrag.

Before travelling to the UNESCO World Heritage Site that is the pearling pathway, you'll be collected from the port and taken to the Bahrain National Museum, where a section dedicated to the pearl diving tradition can be found in the Hall of Traditional Trades and Crafts.

Having set the context for the next part of the tour, we'll move on to the Bu Maher Fort. This part of the pearling pathway is a tribute to famous jeweller Jacques Cartier, who travelled to Bahrain in the 1920s to source its pearls with their unequalled lustre and roundness; the result of freshwater springs in the saltwater sea surrounding Bahrain.



The old houses of Muharraq have been painstakingly renovated and retain all the charming touches of old Arabia with narrow lanes and houses clustered together. You'll visit the Shaikh Ebrahim Bin Mohammed Al Khalifa Center for Culture and Research, a Kurar house and the Iqra Children's Library before enjoying a cup of tea or coffee at the restaurant on site and departing to port.









Let your stresses drift away as you luxuriate in the sumptuous surroundings of the 5-star ART Hotel and Resort.

Located on the Amwaj islands, a group of manmade islands reclaimed from the crystal clear waters of the Arabian Gulf, the ART Hotel and Resort is an oasis of tranquillity and relaxation. On arrival, you'll enjoy a refreshing orange juice beside one of the hotel's beautiful pools as you decide how to spend the rest of your day. Slip on your swimsuit and soak up the sun at the poolside before cooling off with a dip. Or explore the 150 metres of pristine private beachfront that gives way to the welcoming warm waters of the Gulf Sea.

You'll have the option to access the hotel waterpark – perfect for the kids – as well as multiple restaurants serving a range of cuisines. This trip is all about lying back and lapping up the 5-star amenities on this island escape where there's something for everyone.





Dubai







With its heady mix of the traditional and the ultra modern, Dubai offers a seemingly endless list of things to see and do. But we aim to fit a lot of them into this two-day tour of this most populous city of the seven emirates.

Day one will see you exploring the modern part of Dubai, where everything has been built this millennium. First stop will be the Souk Madinat Jumeirah where you can enjoy the traditional Arabian bazaar feel as you wander along the interconnected waterways and lose yourself in the stalls selling perfumes, jewellery, spices and pottery. It also offers the perfect vantage point to see the iconic luxury Burj Al Arab hotel in its full splendour, so cameras at the ready!

Next up is the distinctive Palm Jumeirah – a striking archipelago of man made islands reclaimed from the Arabian Gulf. There'll be time to take photos of the island's breathtaking hotels, including Atlantis The Palm and its new sister hotel, Atlantis The Royal. Then we'll finish the day at the Bluewaters Island, where you can see the Ain Dubai, the world's biggest ferris wheel.



Day two of the tour starts with a trip to the Jumeirah Mosque, said to be the most photographed mosque in Dubai. Take your own pictures of this architectural treasure as your guide gives you a glimpse into the daily life of practising Muslims, before we move on to the nearby Etihad Museum.

Built on the site where the UAE was founded in 1971, the museum's iconic architecture pays homage to that auspicious day. The rise and fall of the pavilion roof call to mind the curves of the unification manuscript, while its seven columns represent the pens used by the nation's founding fathers to sign the agreement. Take some time looking around the museum's exhibits and experiences to learn more about the history of the nation.








Dubai has undergone a huge transformation over the last three centuries, evolving from a small fishing village to an internationally-renowned centre for trade and tourism. Now home to some of the most ambitious property developments in the world, it offers some incredible new sights for you to explore.

You'll start with a photo stop at one the most iconic buildings in Dubai, the sail-shaped Burj Al-Arab Hotel. Then you'll drive through the Palm Jumeirah, an artificial archipelago in the shape of a palm tree, and the location of the magnificent Atlantis Hotel.

Next, we'll visit the beautiful Dubai Marina, a vibrant waterfront hub that's become a very popular spot for leisure and entertainment. From here, we'll drive along Sheikh Zayed Road to spend some time in Souk Al Bahar, which translates to 'The Market of the Sailor'.



Located on a man made island in Lake Burj, at the foot of the Burj Khalifa, this is a modern interpretation of the traditional Arabian marketplace. Wander through more than 100 shops; browse textiles, jewellery, fragrance, fashion and more; or stop at one of the many restaurants, cafes and lounges to soak up the atmosphere and enjoy the view over the water.







Gazing at its ultra modern skyline, it's difficult to believe that Dubai started life as a small fishing village. Today, alongside the luxury and glamour of modern Dubai, there's still plenty to see from those early days. It is these contrasting sides of the city that you'll experience on this full day exploration of old and new Dubai.

Starting with a photo stop at the iconic Palm Jumeirah, the striking palm shaped archipelago, we'll move on to the Lost Chambers Aquarium at the Atlantis hotel. A mesmerising underwater realm, home to more than 65,000 fish and marine animals.

From here, you'll leave the splendour of the modern city to delve into the rich history of the Old Town. Cross the Dubai Creek in a traditional boat to reach the historic Al Fahidi neighbourhood, where much of the mid-19th century infrastructure has been preserved. Enjoy the vibes of the Al Seef waterfront where an old-world heritage area meets the modern world of restaurants, malls and hotels.



Then, as we cruise the Dubai International Financial Center Road, take in Dubai's contemporary skyline and reflect on the area's dramatic rise, before taking the scenic route back to the port.










Journey into the heart of the desert for an unforgettable evening of exhilaration and entertainment amongst the Arabian dunescape.

Your adventure begins with a thrilling ride in a 4x4 over the undulating sand dunes. You'll pause at the top of the dunes to witness the peerless splendour of a desert sunset, made more spectacular by the clean dry air that makes the red golden hues even more vivid.

Then it's time to make your way to a traditional desert camp, where, as night falls, you'll enjoy an authentic taste of the local cuisine with a delicious barbecue dinner under the stars. And get a culture fix with traditional dance and music to entertain you. If you're looking for some extra fun, there'll be a chance to try sandboarding or even take a camel ride.









Standing at 828 metres, the Burj Khalifa is the world's tallest building and one of Dubai's most iconic landmarks. It's part of the Dubai Mall, and a must-visit for anyone spending time in the city.

On this tour, you can take a moment to marvel at its awe-inspiring architecture before you ascend to the 'At The Top' observation decks on level 124, using the world's fastest double-decker elevators. With a 360-degree panoramic vista and high-powered telescopes to get a closer look at the world below, you'll experience views like no other across Dubai. You'll even have access to an outdoor terrace for a thrilling perspective of the dramatic skyline.

Once you're ready to leave, you can indulge in the luxury shopping and entertainment experience of the Dubai Mall. Browse an array of boutiques, visit one of the many cafes and restaurants, and admire the waters of the Dubai Fountain before heading back to the ship.








Enjoy the thrill of a lifetime with our actionpacked dune safari adventure.

Leave the bustle of the city behind and get ready to experience the delights of the Arabian dunes. You'll start with an exciting roller coaster ride over the soft golden sands outside Dubai, speeding up and down the ever-shifting dunes in a modern 4x4 vehicle. Hold on tight as you slide, spin and skid your way towards a secluded desert campsite.

The campsite is nestled in majestic sand dunes and decorated in authentic Arabic style, perfect for some Insta-worthy snaps. It's the ideal place to relax after your fast-paced ride, but if you're ready for more, you'll also have the option to ride a camel.



No trip to Dubai is truly complete without a camel-riding experience, which promises to be a relatively gentle experience. So sit comfortably, sway across the desert and connect with ancient traditions on your short trek across the stunning windswept landscape. There's no better way to complete your dune experience.









Would you like to know what Dubai looked like before the skyscrapers? Find out as we take you on a journey into Dubai's past and traditions.

You'll start in Deira, Dubai's Old Town, one of the oldest parts of the city. Mingle with the crowds at the Gold Souk and Spice Souk before boarding an abra – a traditional merchant's boat made of wood – and crossing the bustling Dubai Creek.

On the other side, you'll find the Al Fahidi Historical Neighbourhood. The winding alleyways are lined with traditional buildings, many of which have been restored to museums. Take time to explore the Bayt Al Khanyar Museum, or Dagger Museum, dedicated to the 'khanjar' dagger: a traditional symbol of strength and bravery.


Our final stop is the Coffee Museum. Here you'll have a lesson in coffee etiquette, learning how guests are honoured in Arabic culture. In this silent ritual, every gesture – such as how the cup is held – has a deep meaning. You'll leave with a memento of your day: a pouch of real Arabic coffee, so you can try and recreate what you've learned once you're back at home.





Khasab









Musandam's mountainous backdrop and craggy, fjord-like inlets inspired its reputation as the Norway of Arabia. On this spectacular half-day excursion, you'll cruise along Khawr Shamm, the region's longest fjord, in a traditional Arabian dhow.

Sit back and be awed by the majestic white limestone cliffs soaring out of calm turquoise waters to heights of up to 1,000 metres. Then soak up the atmosphere as you make your way past small islands, peninsulas, coral reefs and fishing villages. You may even spot some dolphins swimming alongside the boat.

Towards the centre of Khawr Shamm you'll see a small, flat island rising out of the water. This is Telegraph Island, home in 1864 to a British telegraph station which oversaw the telegraph cable running between India and Iraq. It was abandoned five years later as the Europeans manning the station struggled to cope with the overpowering heat and humidity. There'll be no such hardships for you as you enjoy this breathtaking landscape from the cool of the water.







Immerse yourself in the rugged beauty of the Musandam Peninsula and its capital Khasab with a coach and boat tour round some of the region's most beautiful sights.

Your day will begin with a coach trip around Khasab and its surrounding areas to whet your appetite for the sights to come. Our first scheduled stop will be the picturesque Khasab Fort, built in the 17th century by the Portuguese. The structure you see today is the result of extensive restoration work, but inside its low crenellated walls you'll see a large central tower that is thought to pre-date the fort itself.

Next we'll head to Khasab city centre and its Grand Mosque, where there'll be plenty of photo opportunities before boarding the coach to Bukha, about an hour away. You'll be treated to some spectacular scenery on the coastal road and various stops along the way to add to your holiday album.

Overlooking the Arabian Gulf, Bukha's impressive fort is beautifully preserved and well worth a look, as is the imposing watchtower perched in the mountains above.



From Bukha, we'll drive to Khasab Port and swap the open road for tranquil waters. Your traditional Arabian dhow will take you along Khasab's scenic coastline then anchor for a spot of lunch on board, and snorkelling for those who want to explore the world underwater. After which, it's back to the Marina with wonderful, newly forged memories.










At almost 7,000 feet, Jebel Al-Harim (Mountain of Women) is the highest peak on the Musandam Peninsula. So just imagine how spectacular the views will be on this jeep safari to the mountain's summit.

As you journey to the mountain top in a 4x4, you'll feast your eyes on terraced mountain villages, lush forests and winding dry river beds. While a stop at the stunning viewpoint at Khawr Najid will reward you with panoramic views over the Indian Ocean.

We'll make a stop en route at the Bedouin village of Sayah, where the inhabitants live at an elevation of 3,000 feet. Surrounded by palm groves and almond trees, this is a truly idyllic setting. And a chance to steep yourself in the traditional Bedouin way of life.

Then it's the final drive to Jebel Al-Harim's summit and the breathtaking view over the rugged grandeur of the Hajar mountain range. A suitably awe-inspiring end to an experience packed with striking scenery.









Khawr Shamm is Musandam's longest and arguably most spectacular fjord, home to Telegraph Island and your destination for this blissful half day trip.

You'll travel by dhow from Kashab's port to the narrow opening of the Khawr Shamm fjord, where the soaring cliffs will seem to part and allow you entrance. Then you'll cruise to the middle of the fjord, where Telegraph Island rises from the water and the remains of the telegraph station can be seen. Five years after it was established to protect the telegraph cable running from India to Iraq it was abandoned, the Eurpoean's in charge unable to bear the climate.

An hour's snorkelling in the pristine waters around the island will set you up for the return to Kashab Marina with photo stops on the way. Keep your fingers crossed for the dolphins that often accompany the boats sailing along Khasab's coastline. The perfect end to a relaxing day.










From mountain peaks to coastal scenery, this full day's excursion explores the splendour of Musandam's varied terrain.

Your day will start with a 4x4 drive to the top of Jebel Al-Harim - Musandam's highest mountain. Enjoy the terraced mountain villages, lush forests and winding dry river beds you'll see en route. Not to mention the panoramic views over the Indian Ocean from the Khawr Najid viewpoint. A stop at the idyllic Bedouin village of Sayah, located 3,000 feet above sea level will give you an insight into their traditional way of life, before you make your final ascent. A breathtaking view over the Hajar mountain range awaits you at the mountain's peak.

From the grandeur of the mountains to the calm of the coast. We'll drive from Jebel Al-Harim to the port at Kashab, where you'll board a dhow for a soothing sail along Khasab's scenic coastline. We'll put down anchor for lunch on board, then swimming and snorkelling for those with energy left to burn. On the way back to the Kashab port you might just be lucky enough to see some dolphins, topping off an adventure to remember.










Brace yourself for an adrenaline-fuelled experience like no other when you ride the Flying Fox, the world's longest zipline over water.

You will be picked up from the port at Kashab and taken to the Oman Adventures Centre where you'll be given a safety briefing and a harness. Then you're all set to experience 1,800 metres of exhilarating zipline – from a platform on Jebel Fitt, towards the coast of the Wilayat of Kashab and ending at the Atana Khasab Hotel.

Not only will you travel at up to 80kph - a heart-stopping experience in itself - but you'll be travelling over the beautiful Musandam shoreline, with incomparable aerial views of Khor Qadi and the Mokhi region.








Sir Bani Yas







Discover the story behind the stunning wildlife of Sir Bani Yas Island with a guided tour in a specially designed Land Cruiser.

The Arabian Wildlife Park is a beautiful nature reserve that occupies more than half of the island. It was established in 1977 by Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan when he passed a law preventing hunting on the island. His vision was to create a haven for animals – both local and foreign – to roam free and live naturally.

It's now home to thousands of animals, and your local expert guide will help you spot many different species as you explore – and give you plenty of photo stops along the way. Look out for gazelles, llamas, giraffes, ostriches and one of the world's largest herds of endangered Arabian oryx. There are cheetahs, hyenas, and more than 100 species of indigenous wild birds, while the waters around the island are home to sea turtles and dolphins.



All developmental work on the island has been carried out with a view to conserving its fragile ecosystem. You'll return to the ship having enjoyed time alongside some wonderful creatures you may otherwise never see in such a natural setting.

If you're in a larger group, you can tour the nature reserve together in a truck instead of a 4x4.









Gain a unique insight into life on Sir Bani Yas island as it was hundreds of years ago, in this guided tour around the remains of an early-Christian monastery site.

The monastery dates back to the end of the 6th century, and is the only early Christian site in the UAE. Buried over time, it was rediscovered on the eastern side of the island in the early 1990s, and excavations have been taking place ever since.

During your guided walking tour, you'll learn more about the history of the area and the lifestyle of its inhabitants. You'll also be able to view artefacts unearthed by the archaeologists.

Following your tour, you'll re-board your coach for a visit to the Majlis, at the centre and highest point of the island. This was where many dignitaries were welcomed and entertained during Sheik Zayed's lifetime, and offers spectacular views. From there, we'll take a drive around the rest of this beautiful island before heading back to the pier.
